Type of Emergency Behavior Intervention	The maximum length of time:
(1) Short personal restraint	May not be exceeded.
(2) Personal restraint	May not be exceeded.
(3) Emergency medication	Not applicable.
(4) Seclusion	<p>May be exceeded if the caregiver obtains a written continuation order before the end of the time period from the licensed psychiatrist, psychologist, or physician with written clinical justification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (A) Indicating that the emergency situation continues to exist; and (B) For the length of time the psychiatrist, psychologist, or physician permits the child to be secluded, which must not exceed four hours.
(5) Mechanical restraint	<p>May be exceeded if the caregiver obtains a written continuation order before the end of the time period from the licensed psychiatrist with written clinical justification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (A) Indicating that the emergency situation continues to exist; and (B) For the length of time the psychiatrist permits the child to be restrained, which must not exceed four hours.
